Our 90th anniversary year

The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art celebrated with Kansas City and more than 500,000 visitors who explored galleries, attended programs and festivals, and made us part of their lives. This year saw incredible gifts of art made to the collection, including Grand HexaNet by Venezuelan artist Elias Crespin that moves (literally!) the museum's collection into a new era.

Throughout this report, you will find stories from this milestone year and gratitude for the people, foundations, and businesses who make our work possible through their generosity. Joyful events such as the C100 Luncheon, ShuttleCork, and Party Arty provided significant funds to bolster our mission and introduce new audiences to the museum.

During the 90th celebration, we also heard from you as part of our 90th Anniversary Response Station project and in this report, we share quotes and stories from museum attendees who took the time to share their personal experiences and cherished memories as part of this project.

In the galleries, our popular KC Art Now series continued with A Layered Presence/Una Presencia Estratificada, highlighting work by 22 regional Latin-American artists whose voices and art were shared through six wonderful programs. In Evelyn Hofer: Eyes on the City, visitors experienced the first major exhibition of Hofer's work in the U.S. in more than 50 years. This powerful exhibition used more than 100 of her photographs to convey the essence of her subjects and the unique character and personality of European and American capitals during a period of social, structural, and economic transformation following World War II. Soon after, the museum opened Monet and his Modern Legacy which explored Monet's influence on later generations of American artists and featured three remarkable loans from the Musée Marmottan Monet in Paris.

Though much has changed in nine decades, our commitment to providing exceptional experiences with art, culture, history, and festivals — for free, for everyone — is stronger than ever. Today, we see the role of museums evolving from exhibiting and preserving masterpieces to also providing a place for community, joy, belonging, and wellbeing. As we turn our gaze to the Centennial, the Nelson-Atkins is preparing for what it means to be a museum for future generations.

Our achievements this past year are thanks to the tremendous support and leadership of our donors, volunteers, and members. You are the Art & Soul of this museum.



The Spencer Art Reference Library's exhibition, The Nelson-Atkins at 90: 1933–2023 told the story of the museum and its milestones through ephemera drawn from its deep, rarely seen archives.














Stronger together

This year, more than 400 Nelson-Atkins volunteers served our community. Volunteers are museum ambassadors — welcoming, educating, and fostering a sense of belonging for every person who enters our doors.

UMKC x NAMA

The Nelson-Atkins proudly hosted events in partnership with talented musicians from the University of Missouri – Kansas City Conservatory. Sight x Sound: An Art & Music Series and For the Birds explored the fascinating intersections of art, music, and performance.

Creature collaboration

Mexican artist Miguel Bolivar spent five weeks in Kansas City creating the larger-than-life alebrije sculptures seen at the Día de los Muertos festival. Bolivar was assisted by local community groups and volunteers, including students from the Guadalupe Center High School Impact Academy and Mattie Rhodes Cultural Center.

Bringing global cultures to KC

The museum's annual cultural festivals — Lunar New Year, Passport to India, Native American Cultural Celebration, Juneteenth Celebration, Kansas City's Lawn Party, Deaf Cultural Festival, and Día de los Muertos — continued to be community favorites. Together, they drew more than 32,000 guests to the museum.

Capturing KC

Inspired by the featured exhibition Evelyn Hofer: Eyes on the City and in collaboration with Kansas City Society for Contemporary Photography, participants in the Portrait of a City workshop studied street photography and captured images of Kansas City. The photographs were subsequently exhibited at Cerbera Gallery and bound into a catalogue.

Picture Day

At the Middle School Summit, students were invited to explore the museum's photography collection, conduct interviews, and create portraits of themselves and their peers.

Reflections from Curatorial Affairs

It was a year of great art at the Nelson-Atkins, bookended with major retrospectives of important women artists.

Co-organized with The High Museum of Art and opened in September 2023, Evelyn Hofer: Eyes on the City presented the transportive urban photography of Evelyn Hofer. The Nelson-Atkins is one of the largest repositories of Hofer's works, thanks to the Hall Family Foundation.

In April 2024, we debuted the first U.S. museum full-career survey of Niki de Saint Phalle: Rebellion and Joy, whose distinctive works disrupted the art world and engaged with critical social issues.

Indeed, it was a year of exhibitions celebrating women in art. In October 2023, artist Sonam Dolma Brauen presented the moving installation My Father's Death (2010). In November, Glamorous Women revealed women's roles in China's elite society. And in March 2024, the museum opened "To Prove that I Exist": Melissa Shook's Daily Self Portraits, 1972–1973, featuring early self-portraits by the influential artist Melissa Shook.

Monet and his Modern Legacy explored the influence of Claude Monet's later works, complemented by four exceptional paintings from the Musée Marmottan Monet in Paris and a local collector.

Contemporary artists enriched our walls — and ceilings. Opened in September 2023, the exhibition A Layered Presence/Una prescencia estratificada showcased 22 local artists with cultural ties to Latin America. And in March 2024, Venezuelan artist Elias Crespin installed his kinetic sculpture Grand HexaNet (2018), which dances above Bloch Lobby.

The European Arts department added a new digital publication with its first installment of the Starr Portrait Miniatures collection catalogue, sponsored by the Bloch Family Foundation and the Starr Family Foundation.

An extraordinary, multi-year grant from the Hall Family Foundation will fund strategic acquisitions and essential research for our photography curators. And as a silver lining to the bequest-mandated sale of Claude Monet's Mill at Limetz (1888), the museum's share of the proceeds will create an endowment honoring the Atha family and ensuring decades of ambitious acquisitions.

Finally, two highly anticipated curatorial hires bring renewed attention to important collections. Rachel Kabukala returned to the museum in January 2024 as Associate Curator, African Art. Tahnee Ahtone joined in April 2024 as Curator, Native American Art, a position supported by a multi-year grant from the Mellon-Wingate Foundation.

The curators, conservators, registrars, and exhibition planning teams join me in thanking you for making our work possible. We look forward to seeing you in the galleries!

Monet makes an impression

Monet and His Modern Legacy explored the influence of Claude Monet's later works on the Abstract Expressionist movement of the 20th century — and uncovered the Kansas City Art Institute's pivotal role in the museum's monumental acquisition of Monet's Water Lilies.

Evelyn Hofer's globetrotting photography

The exhibition *Evelyn Hofer: Eyes on the City* featured the photographer's thoughtful portraits of the world's cities and the people who inhabit them.

A garden of joy

Niki de Saint Phalle: Rebellion and Joy brought the trailblazing avant-garde artist's imaginative and socially conscious works — including the iconic, feminist Nana sculptures — to the Nelson-Atkins.

Local artists reveal their layers

The KC Art Now exhibition series returned with A Layered Presence / Una presencia estratificada. The bilingual exhibition featured 22 Kansas City artists with cultural ties to Latin America, delving into such themes as immigration, LGBTQIA+ identity, and ancestry.

A grand acquisition

This spring, the Nelson-Atkins unveiled the kinetic sculpture *Grand HexaNet* by Venezuelan artist Elias Crespin. Its network of anodized aluminum tubes floats in a perpetual dance over Bloch Lobby. The acquisition was made possible by the William T. Kemper Collecting Initiative — Latin American/Caribbean Art Fund.

A major collection of miniatures

A new digital catalogue brings to life more than 250 pocket-sized paintings. Collected by Kansas City philanthropists Martha Jane Phillips Starr and John W. Starr, the Starr Collection of Portrait Miniatures, accessible on the museum's website, features deep scholarship and high-resolution images of each portrait.

Meditations on family and memory

Last fall, artist Sonam Dolma Brauen visited the Nelson-Atkins to construct her sculpture *My Father's Death*. Composed of traditional votives and robes donated by Tibetan Buddhist monks, the installation is a moving tribute to the artist's father, himself a Tibetan monk.















China's early trendsetters

Glamorous Women: Gender and Fashion in Chinese Art used rarely seen paintings, textiles, and objects to explore how Chinese artists revealed the roles women played in elite society.

Selfies that stick

"To Prove that I Exist": Melissa Shook's Daily Self-Portraits, 1972–1973 chronicled Melissa Shook's daily self-portraits, which powerfully conveyed her relationships with memory, family, her body, and sense of self.

Visiting visionaries

Photographer Catherine Opie and art star Khalif Tahir Thompson shared their works with guests in lively artist conversations. Actor, collector, and museum founder Cheech Marin described his vision for the power of Chicano art in the annual Atkins Lecture.

FINANCIALS

I'm pleased to report another great year at the Nelson-Atkins, thanks to the service and contributions from friends like you. The balanced operational budget for the museum was \$34.4 million for the fiscal year ending April 30, 2024.

Early in the year, \$1.2 million of unrestricted funds became available through a final approval of Employee Retention Credit (ERC) funding earned during the pandemic. This, combined with successful fundraising and strong earned revenue allowed the museum to finish the year with balanced operations at \$36.1 million.

The increased funding allowed for growth beyond what was budgeted in ongoing departmental expenses and project expenses associated with the year's exhibitions and programming. Departmental growth included the filling of additional staff positions.

Volunteer leadership from three committees provides critical financial oversight throughout the year. The Finance Committee reviews budgets and monitors operational results. The Investment Committee oversees current investment performance and offers recommendations to the Board regarding Investment Policy, including asset allocation. The Audit Committee recommends the engagement of a firm for audit and tax preparation services for the museum and approves the audit results and tax returns before recommending to the Board. The time and expertise committed by these individuals in service to the museum is greatly appreciated.

We thank each of you for helping the Nelson-Atkins provide another great year of exhibitions and programming for our community.


